# Call for Scholarship Applications for 2018 at Addis Ababa Institute of Technology in Ethiopia

Funded by the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)

**Application Closing Date: 28 February 2018** 



## Programme Objectives

DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service), as a publicly funded, selfgoverning organisation of the institutions of higher education in Germany, promotes international academic exchange as well as educational co-operation with developing countries through a variety of funding and scholarship programmes.

As part of the "In-Country/In-Region Scholarship Programme" DAAD offers scholarships for Master studies. The programme is funded by the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and aims at university staff in the first line, without neglecting the public sector demand of academically trained personnel.

The target group for scholarships are graduates from Sub-Sahara Africa with a first academic degree who want to pursue Master's courses in their home country (so called **In-Country scholarships**) or in another Eastern Africa country (so called **In-Region scholarships**).

It has been agreed upon that DAAD cooperates with Addis Ababa Institute of Technology by offering up to **8 In-Country/In-Region scholarships** for Master studies for the intake 2018.

# Application requirements

# Applicants

- have successfully completed generally a three-year university degree (Master candidates) with above average results (upper forth of class)
- clearly show motivation and strong commitment
- have thorough knowledge of the language of instruction
- have completed their last university degree not more than 6 years ago at the time of application
- must be nationals or permanent resident of Sub-Sahara Africa
- should generally be a) staff member of a public university, b) candidate considered for teaching or research staff recruitment, c) from the public sector d) DAFI-Alumni (Albert Einstein German Academic Refugee Initiative)

Female applicants and candidates from less privileged regions or groups are especially encouraged to participate in the programme.

The scholarships are initially granted for one year and can be extended to upon receipt of an application for extension. Scholars must demonstrate satisfactory progress before an extension is granted. All further information will be provided after admission to the scholarship programme.

#### Eligible fields

The In-Country/In-Region Scholarship Programme supports studies in subject areas with strong relevance to national development.

The scholarships at Addis Ababa Institute of Technology are available in the following fields:

- Multidisciplinary Engineering
- Electrical and Computer Engineering
- Mechanical and Industrial Engineering
- Civil and Environmental Engineering

# The application process contains two steps.

#### First step:

Applicants must apply for their studies at Addis Ababa Institute of Technology using the contacts and the method that is prescribed by the institution. Addis Ababa Institute of Technology has set its own deadlines.

Addis Ababa Institute of Technology will screen, pre-select (according to DAAD selection criteria) and short-list the applicants. A detailed report consisting of the shortlisting procedure, the entire list of applicants, the ranked shortlist and the shortlisting panel members will also be availed to DAAD. The ranked shortlist will contain double or triple the number of scholarships that have been attributed to the institution.

DAAD reserves the right of final selection.

#### Second step:

Pre-selected candidates are asked to log into the DAAD portal and register themselves and submit an DAAD application.

- Apply online via the DAAD-Portal under the tab "Personal Funding"/ "Application"

## Documents to be submitted:

- DAAD application form duly filled (available in the DAAD-Portal)
- Hand signed curriculum vitae (please use the european specimen form at <a href="http://europass.cedefop. Europa.eu">http://europass.cedefop. Europa.eu</a>), including a list of publications (if applicable).
- Recommendation letter by university teachers
- Letter of admission for the host university / institution / network
- Certified copies of university degree certificates including transcripts
- Letter of motivation (if applicable: mentioning the planned research stay in Germany, see "Additional benefits")
- Copy of the passport

Closing date for the submission of DAAD scholarship applications is 22 March 2018

Scholarship funding

The scholarship covers:

Item	Amount in €
Tuition fees	the regularly charged amount
Study and research allowance	230,00 annually
Printing allowance	1025,00 once within the last six months of the scholarship
Monthly scholarship (Accomodation, Food etc.)	Master In-Country: 180,00 Master In-Region: 200,00
Travel allowance (In-Region only)	The flat rate travel allowance will be specified in the letter of award

The scholarship will either be disbursed by the host institution, the German Embassy or will be paid directly to the scholarship holder's banking account. Further details will be announced after admission to the scholarship programme.

Additional benefits

DAAD In-Country/In-Region scholarship holders are also encouraged to apply for a **research grant in Germany** for 2 up to 6 months, if the necessary financial means are available. <u>Please note:</u> **The short-term research stay in Germany should preferably be announced in the application for the regular scholarship.** 

The short-term research scholarship includes:

- a monthly scholarship payment for living costs which amounts to 1.000 € per month
- health/accident/personal liability insurance
- a flat-rate travel allowance

All further details regarding additional benefits and the additional application processes will be provided after admission to the scholarship programme.
